

## The Steinsaltz Library



MAGGID is pleased to announce the launch of the complete works of renowned scholar, philosopher and spiritual mentor, Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz. Beginning in 2011, MAGGID will release new editions of seven of Rabbi Steinsaltz's popular titles, including *The Essential Talmud*, *Teshuva* and *The Thirteen Petalled Rose*. Over the next several years, MAGGID will publish new editions of more than twenty works by Rabbi Steinsaltz—many of which have been out of print for years—and several new books.

MAGGID, which publishes books of contemporary Jewish thought by leading rabbis and scholars, is a division of Koren Publishers Jerusalem. Koren is the publisher of Rabbi Steinsaltz's masterful editions of the Talmud, which have sold millions of copies and have revolutionized Talmud study. With MAGGID's launch of Rabbi Steinsaltz's smaller works, Koren is making the complete library of Rabbi Steinsaltz—which is unsurpassed in its intellectual breadth—available for the first time.

The Steinsaltz Library currently consists of *Biblical Images* (ISBN 978 159 264 294 6), *Talmudic Images* (ISBN 978 159 264 295 3), *The Essential Talmud* (ISBN 978 159 264 298 4), *The Candle of God* (ISBN 978 159 264 297 7), *The Tales of Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav* (ISBN 978 159 264 300 4), *Teshuva* (ISBN 978 159 264 296 0), and *The Thirteen Petalled Rose* (ISBN 978 159 264 301 1). The books are hardcover and range from \$22.95 to \$24.95. They are available online and from Authorized Koren Booksellers everywhere.

Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz is a teacher, philosopher, social critic and prolific author who has been hailed by *Time Magazine* as a “once-in-a-millennium scholar.” In November 2010, he completed his monumental, 45-year effort to elucidate the Talmud and to translate it into modern Hebrew. Rabbi Steinsaltz has written 60 books and hundreds of articles, has established a network of schools in Israel and the former Soviet Union, and holds several honorary degrees. He was born and lives in Jerusalem.

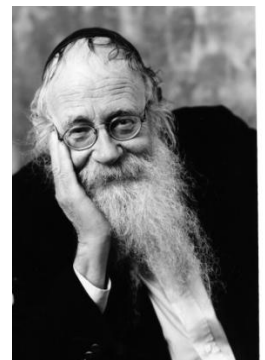
